- follow school-approved social media pages to stay informed
- volunteering and/or attending at the school
- participating, as appropriate, in decisions relating to each child's education.
- promoting positive use of the child's extracurricular time.
- staying informed about each child's education, receiving notices from Carver and the school district, and communicating with those parties as needed and when appropriate.
- serving, to the extent possible, on policy advisory groups, such as Title 1 and School Advisory Council

Students will share, with teachers and families, the responsibility to work toward success by:

- staying focused and actively participate in classes.
- completing assignments when given and asking for help when needed.
- being kind to and advocating for each other.
- reading at least 30 minutes every day outside of school time.
- participating in afterschool clubs, activities, and athletics.
- giving parents/guardians all notices and information sent home from the school with the intention of keeping families informed.
- reporting dangerous situations or problems to the school and/or parents/guardians.
